Masresha is a natural leader. At age four, he was shepherding his family flock in the hills of Addis Ababa. Three years since making Aliyah, he is part of *Derech Hateva's* **Kehillat Natan Leadership Fellowship**. He is now leading his peers, fellow immigrants from around the world in his new home, Israel.

Masresha is a teacher. As a Kehillat Natan teen, he runs a weekly workshop for 20 of his peers on mutual responsibility and environmental sensitivity.

Masresha is an outdoor guide. At the end of the school year, he will lead these classmates on a multi-day hike in Israel's mountains, to share values he learned with *Derech Hateva*: teamwork, determination, and the importance of cherishing one's environment.

"Derech Hateva's approach to a community in-need is to empower members of that community. The greatest gift we can give youth-at-risk is the opportunity to lead. Thousands of teens in Israel want so badly to fix the world. We tell them they can, teach them skills & support them as they do it. Eyes glow most when they reflect the confident awareness of 'I can- And I did.' And that glow is contagious.
